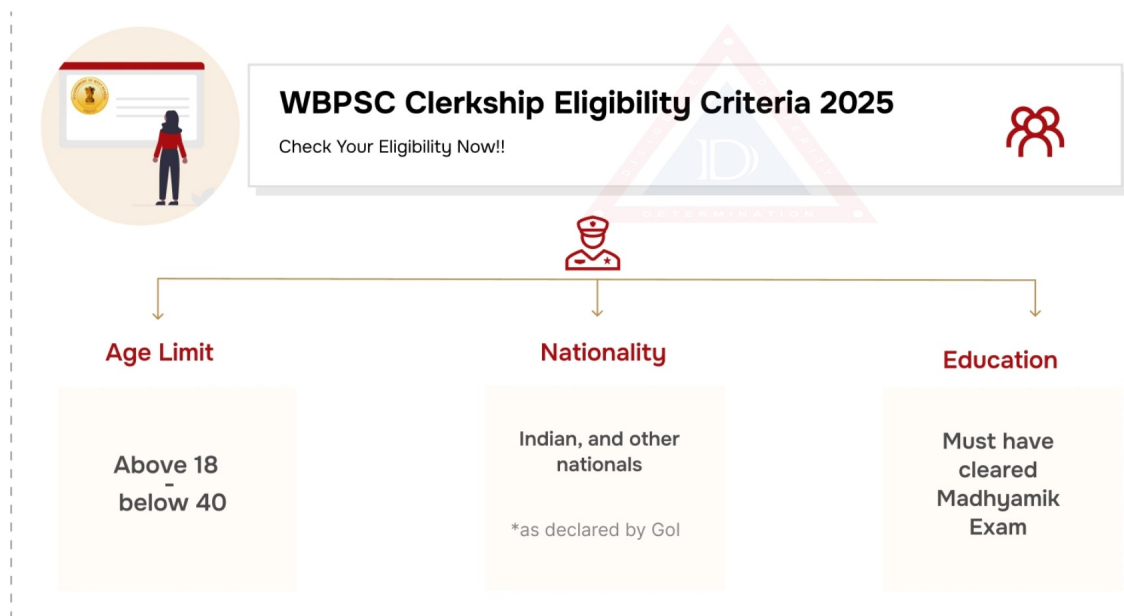

- You must be between 18 and 40 years old.
- Remember, your age as per the Madhyamik or equivalent certificate will be accepted.

- **SC/ST Candidates (West Bengal)** - 5 years relaxation in the upper age limit.
- **OBC (Non-Creamy Layer) Candidates (West Bengal)** - 3 years age relaxation.
- **Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD)** - Upper age limit relaxable up to 45 years.
- **Candidates from Other States** - No relaxation for SC/ST/OBC candidates from other states; they will be treated as General candidates.
- **Ex-Servicemen** - Those with at least six months of continuous service in any rank of the Armed Forces can deduct their service duration from their actual age. However, the final age after deduction should not exceed the maximum age limit by more than 3 years.

## Educational Qualification

- You must have successfully passed the Madhyamik Examination conducted by the West Bengal Board of Secondary Education or an equivalent examination.
- Additionally, you are required to possess elementary knowledge in computer operation and demonstrate the ability to type at a speed of 20 words per minute in English or 10 words per minute in Bengali.

## Other Requirements

- As an aspiring candidate, you must be a citizen of India, either by birth or through registration.
- Alternatively, you can be other nationals as declared eligible by the Government of India. If you belong to the latter category, it is essential that you hold a certificate of eligibility issued by the Government.
- Additionally, you should have the ability to read, write, and speak in Bengali (unless your mother tongue is Nepali), as specified in the Finance Department's Notification No.1243-F(P) dated 02.03.2016.
